The Hungarian Social Report: administrative details

Financing: Ministry of welfare (or equivalents)

Non-partisan consensus

Costs: approx 30000 EUR

Circulation: 2000-3000 copies (English: 1000)

Main consumers: students at universities, researchers, policy makers, general audience
